Information for parents

This learning pack has been created to give you and your children a variety of activities and ideas to choose from while they are at home linked to their 7 areas of learning. Can you add more detail to your picture from yesterday or do a video of yourself explaining how it works? What happens when a bike gets a puncture?	Have a race on your bike / scooter /space hopper – which one is the fastest and why?
Expressive Arts and Design	Design a vehicle using pens. Crayons and paper. What do you want it to be like? How many wheels might it have? How to people drive it?	Use construction eg lego, duplo to make your design – can it move?	Can you use junk to make your vehicle design? Is it a rocket that flies or something that travels on the road.


