Information for parents


Reading

Ask the children to think of as many tricky words as they can in 3 minutes and write them down.</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=V_vqM1BXePE E (Mission impossible 3 minute timer music)</p> <p>Review and revise.</p>	<p><u>Phonics</u> Write a variety of the tricky words from the past few weeks. For example; have, like, said, come, here, do, one etc. Hide around the hosue and play mission impossible music while children find as many as they can before the music stops.</p> <p>Revise and review.</p>	<p><u>Phonics</u> Can you... - Read the sentence - Draw a picture</p> <p>"I am big and strong." Using their phonics sounds (using sound mats) can children write a caption/senetnce about this picture:</p>  <p>Can they read it themselves? Have they used finger spaces? Have you formed your letters correctly?</p>
