In Outdoor learning we will:

Learn about how to be safe when we're outside, whether it's using tools or being around the fire.

There will be a focus on team work and helping our friends through variety of outdoor messy and mucky challenges.

As Mathematicians we will:

Look at place value using a number of different manipulatives from 1-20 building to 50 for Year 1 and numbers 1-100 for Year 2.

Children will also spend time on addition and subtraction (including money).

Year 2 will work on multiplication whilst Year 1 are deepening their understanding of place value.

As Athletes we will:

Look at using our bodies to run, jump, throw and catch through learning different playground games.

In RE we will:

Look at what it means to be part of a faith community and understanding how we fit into that community.

As Writers we will be focusing on story telling

Focus on our basic skills through story telling. We will be using The Boy Who Cried Ninja by Alex Latimer, writing a story about a character who finds that telling the truth is best.

Write a story based on Little Red Riding Hood changing some key details.

As Citizens we will: (PSHE/Mind Up)

This half term we will be looking at the unit 'Being me in my World', which will be about understanding the children's rights and responsibilities and understanding that their views are important.

How could you be the next Olympic Athlete?

How has Nelson Mandela helped to make the world a better place?

As Design Technologists we will:

Research, design and make our own boats and rafts. We aim to take the finished vehicles to the stream below school and hopefully they will float!

As Artists we will:

Be creating a number of different self portraits and learning about Modigliani and Arcimboldo.

As Scientists we will:

Look at what our body is made of; naming and identifying different parts of our body; looking at the senses we have and use and identifying different types of food that help to keep us healthy.

As Historians and Geographers we will:

Learn how Nelson Mandela helped to make the world a better place.

Identify why a meerkat can't live in the North Pole – looking at different types of weather and climate.

As Readers we will:

Create and embed a love of reading and listening to stories.

Take part in daily Read Write Inc lessons, revise and learn our phonemes and spelling rules, improving our reading fluency.

Visit the library on a regular basis and love the magical space we have!

As Musicians we will: We will play and perform in a variety of contexts. We will be showing control and expression using both our voices and musical instruments. There will be opportunity to improvise and compose music for a range of purposes.
